Year 6 - Miss Holmes/Mrs Nuttall (Mrs Broadbelt & Mr Islam)


The children in Year 6 will be split into two smaller groups for maths and English in the mornings and will return together in the afternoons for the other curriculum subjects.

School reports will be sent out week commencing 15<sup>th</sup> July 2024 and it has been lovely to read the school reports this year and see how much the children have achieved. As a school we have a duty to make you aware of the end of year attendance figures as absence from school can have a significant impact upon academic and social and emotional development. The target for school attendance is 96% although we are aware of reasons for some children why this is lower. Children whose attendance figures are below 90% are classed as persistently absent from school and this will be closely monitored over the next year when we should hopefully see improvements. The expected attendance target for children at Britannia is 96% and we appreciate your support with this in the coming year. Absences from school can impact both academically and socially.

The last few weeks in school are extremely busy and we are looking forward to sharing some lovely experiences with the children.
