I am delighted to inform you that both our pupils and staff have settled into their new classrooms seamlessly, and the energy and enthusiasm throughout the school has been lovely to see.

I would like to extend a warm welcome to our new parents and pupils. We are thrilled to have you join our Britannia family, and we look forward to working in close partnership with you to support your child's educational journey.

At Britannia, we firmly believe that the collaboration between home and school is crucial in ensuring the success and well-being of our pupils. We maintain an open-door policy, and you are always welcome to reach out to us with any questions or concerns you may have. However, please do be mindful that during the school day, our teachers may not be able to respond to emails immediately, as they will be focused on preparing lessons and teaching your children. We will aim to respond to emails within 3-5 working days, but you may receive a response sooner. For any more urgent matters, please do not hesitate to contact the school office.

This year, I am delighted to welcome Coach Zack to our team as our new sports coach and I am sure you will join us in making him feel like a valued member of our Britannia family. He will be working with the classes at lunchtime, providing additional extra-curricular sports and delivering PE sessions in the afternoon.


The children have been very excited that our school hall has been freshly painted, and we are eagerly awaiting the installation of our new artwork, which will help launch our new vision and values. This exciting project has been a collaborative effort, with input from our entire school community.

Attendance at school is extremely important and this is closely monitored throughout the year. We expect that children will attend school every day and arrive on time unless they are too unwell. A child whose attendance is below 90% is classed as persistently absent and school endeavours to work with families to improve these figures. This data is monitored by school, the local authority and the DFE. Our target for each child's attendance at Britannia is 96%. Should school have any concerns about your child's attendance, we will get in touch with you. Throughout the year, you will receive regular updates through use of a traffic light letter to keep you informed of your child's attendance. Regularly missing school can result in your child developing gaps in learning and difficulties with social interaction as friendships can move on.









Holidays will not be authorised except in special circumstances which must be discussed with the Headteacher as our Governing Body have taken the decision to fine for holidays during term time. The Government have released new guidelines for fines which have already been shared with you.

## **Reminders for Parents**
