Please can you send a potato into class and if possible, some craft items to help decorate the character. Send them in on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> March please. It may be helpful to discuss the activity with your child so that you know how big they want their potato to be! You will then be able to come into school to view all of the characters from 3pm on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March. Thank you.
