Long hair should also be tied back as it is a health and safety risk when children are playing out and in PE lessons.

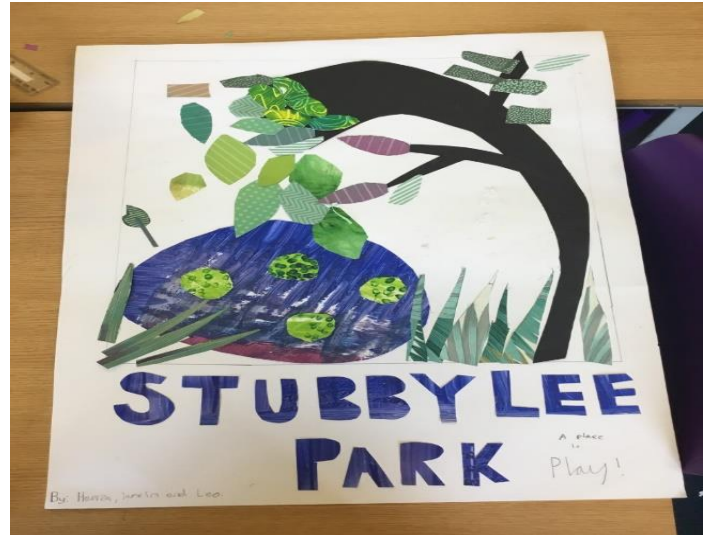
Exciting News
