Main question

Why are rail workers striking?

Listen Think Share

- > Look at the poster image and talk about what you can see. Read through the news story. Are you aware of the rail strikes taking place? Share what you already know.
- > Read the information found on the resource and watch the useful video, which explores the current situation further.
- > Have the strikes affected you? Do you travel by train? Share how you travel to and from school.
- > Who do you think will be most impacted by these strikes? E.g. a railway strike is bad for travellers, who won't be able to reach places they need go, like work and school; it can also be negative for railway companies who run these services, as they will lose out on money from travellers. Though for the workers, it is a powerful way to raise awareness of a situation they don't think is fair.
- > Railway strikes are a form of protest. Talk about how strongly the workers must feel to take this action. Can you think of any other ways that people protest when they want something to change? Action that affects public transport can be an effective form of protest due to the number of people it impacts. Strikes also often attract a lot of interest from news outlets. This strike has divided public and government opinion, with Deputy Labour leader Angela Rayner saying, "No one takes strike action lightly. I will always defend their absolute right to do so for fairness at work." Share your thoughts on the action.
